What is KanCare?

• KanCare = Kansas Medicaid

Provides health insurance for adults and children with limited income and resources

- KanCare supports people in need by giving access to care.
 - Primarily children, pregnant and post-partum parents, elderly adults, and people with disabilities
 - Prenatal care, doctor visits, immunizations, school physicals, prescriptions, nursing facility services, etc.



What changed in 2023?

- During the Public Health Emergency (2020-2023), all households on KanCare were renewed automatically.
- Starting this spring, all households need to fill out paperwork to renew or else they **lose benefits** (even if still eligible).
 - Lack of info = losing coverage without knowing
 - Parents unaware = Kansas children facing crisis



Kansas Renewals Plan (2023-24)

- <u>Kansas</u> started renewals in March chronologically by start date.
- ~30,000 households processed each month.
- Notices are sent each month by postal mail.
- Many have moved and KanCare may have incorrect address.
- No response by due date = coverage ends.
- No mail = no health insurance.
- 90 days to submit renewal paperwork for backdated coverage.
